

EQUINE ADOPTION APPLICATION

The Yavapai Humane Society Equine Center requires that this application be completed in full and submitted prior to the approval of adoption of any equine. Submission of an application does not guarantee adoption of any animal to any person regardless of the date of submission, previous conversations with Yavapai Humane Society staff or representatives, or previous knowledge of the animal. The adoption application is a part of the adoption process. Additional steps may be required for approval, including a site visit. All adopters must be 18 years of age or older. It is understood that adults may wish to adopt for persons under the age of 18. If the adoption is approved, the adult is fully responsible for the care of the adopted equine.

Failure to complete the application will cause processing to be delayed. Providing false information will result in a denial of the application and any future adoption applications.
